Axiom Maths is committed to safeguarding your personal information. Whenever we process such information, we will use and store information in line with both the Axiom Maths Data Protection Policy, this privacy policy and all laws concerning the protection of personal information, including GDPR. The type of personal information we collect

We currently collect and process the following information:

- Full name
- Email address
- School
- GCSE grade
- Year group
- Sex
- Completion of training details
- Anonymised feedback from surveys

- If you take support maths circles online, then we will hold recordings of these sessions for up to 60 days for monitoring and safeguarding reasons.

We may collect further information if the Junior Mentor has additional duties / takes part in additional activities.

How we get the personal information and why we have it

Most of the personal information we process is provided to us directly by you for one of the following reasons:

- Delivery and management of Axiom Maths' programmes, including the maths circles programme.
- Relationship management and communication with schools, partners, stakeholders and interested parties.
- Conducting research and responding to feedback given on surveys.
- Measuring the impact of Axiom Maths' activities.

We also receive personal information indirectly, from the following sources in the following scenarios:

- Schools – For our schools programme, we may receive data related to school staff, maths excellence coordinators, volunteers, Junior Mentors and mentors.
- Delivery partners – We may receive data related to partners' staff and Junior Mentors from the partner in which they work/attend maths circles.
- We also receive data via the Axiom Maths Hub and TalentLMS (if you are a mentor registered on the sites), Typeform and Form Assembly (if you are an active participant completing one of our surveys).

We use this information to effectively manage and deliver our programmes and measure the impact of these activities to further improve our provision.

Sharing data with external organisations

Data may be shared with and processed by third party platforms/software for the purposes of managing our programmes and collecting feedback. This includes the developers of our online platform (the Axiom Maths Hub) who may require data to fix bugs and ensure the smooth running of the platform. Also, data may be shared with an external research organisation to analyse the impact on pupil attainment compared to national statistics.

Axiom Maths transfers personal data to countries outside of the EEA, but only where appropriate safeguards are in place (such as the International Data Transfer Agreement or the International Data Transfer Addendum) or an adequacy decision is in place, in line with data protection legislation. Axiom Maths does not use profiling or automated decision making as part of its processing of personal data.

Lawful Bases

Under the UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR), we use different lawful bases depending on the activity. The main ones are set out below:

- Legitimate interests: the processing is necessary for our legitimate interests or the legitimate interests of a third party, unless there is a good reason to protect the individual's personal data which overrides those legitimate interests. We have identified some of our legitimate interests as effectively managing our organisation, administering the Axiom Maths programmes, supporting our pupils, mentors, volunteers and partners, and measuring the impact of our activities.

For some mentors and circumstances, we may rely on the following lawful bases. Please get in touch if you would like more details on these.

- Consent: the individual has given clear consent for their personal data to be processed for a specific purpose. For example, mentors may give consent to be contacted about local activities / training / events.
- Contract: the processing is necessary for a contract we have with the individual, or because they have asked us to take specific steps before entering into a contract. In some instances, individuals may be under a contractual and/or statutory obligation to provide us with personal data. Without this data, we may not be able to provide the service or manage the programme as required.
- Legal obligation: the processing is necessary for us to comply with the law (not including contractual obligations).
- Vital interests: the processing is necessary to protect someone's life.
- Public task: the processing is necessary for us to perform a task in the public interest or for our official functions, and the task or function has a clear basis in law.

How we store your personal information

Your data protection rights

Under data protection law, you have rights including:

Your right to access – You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information and other supplementary information.

Your right to rectification – You have the right to ask us to rectify personal information you think is inaccurate. You also have the right to ask us to complete information you think is incomplete.

Your right to erasure – You have the right to ask us to erase your personal information in certain circumstances.

Your right to restriction of processing – You have the right to ask us to restrict the processing of your personal information in certain circumstances.

Your right to object to processing – You have the right to object to the processing of your personal information in certain circumstances.

Your right to data portability – You have the right to ask that we transfer, move or copy the personal information you gave us to another organisation, or to you, in certain circumstances.

Your right to withdraw consent – You have the right to withdraw consent for data processing, where consent has been given.

If you make a request, we have one month to respond to you.
